



Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006

Tushar Patel (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Paul Gregson Haugen and Gregory Paul Haugen (the 'Tenants') because the Tenants did not pay the rent that the Tenants owe.

This application was heard by videoconference on June 29, 2021. Only the Landlord attended the hearing. As of 3:16 p.m., the Tenants were not present or represented at the hearing although properly served with notice of this hearing by the Board.

Determinations:

1. The Tenants have not paid the total rent the Tenants were required to pay for the period from October 1, 2018 to June 30, 2021. Because of the arrears, the Landlord served a Notice of Termination effective January 31, 2021.
2. The Tenants are in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful monthly rent is \$850.00.
4. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$850.00 from the Tenants and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord.
5. Interest on the rent deposit is owing to the Tenants for the period from April 1, 2017 to January 31, 2021.
6. The Tenants paid \$1,575.00 after the application was filed.
7. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83 of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (RTA), including the impact of COVID-19 on the parties and whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the Tenant. The Landlord has reached out to the Tenants on multiple occasions regarding the rental arrears. He offered that they could pay the arrears in

installments. However, the Tenants failed to do so. I find that it **would be** unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. Unless the Tenant voids the order as set out below, the tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenants is terminated. The Tenants must move out of the rental unit on or before July 24, 2021.
2. The Tenants shall pay to the Landlord \$7,630.83*, which represents the amount of rent owing and compensation up to July 13, 2021, less the rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit.
3. The Tenants shall also pay to the Landlord \$27.95 per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting July 14, 2021 to the date the Tenants move out of the unit.
4. The Tenants shall also pay to the Landlord \$186.00 for the cost of filing the application.
5. If the Tenants do not pay the Landlord the full amount owing* on or before July 24, 2021, the Tenants will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from July 25, 2021 at 2.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
6. If the unit is not vacated on or before July 24, 2021, then starting July 25, 2021, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
7. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord, on or after July 25, 2021.
8. If, on or before July 24, 2021, the Tenants pay the amount of \$9,261.00** to the Landlord or to the Board in trust, this order for eviction will be void. This means that the tenancy would not be terminated, and the Tenants could remain in the unit. If this payment is not made in full and on time, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
9. The Tenants may make a motion to the Board under subsection 74(11) of the Act to set aside this order if they pay the amount required under that subsection on or after July 25, 2021 but before the Sheriff gives vacant possession to the Landlord. The Tenants are only entitled to make this motion once during the period of the tenancy agreement with the Landlord.
