



Order under Section 69

DD Acquisitions Partnership (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Reilly Tara (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on July 5, 2021.

Only the Landlord's Legal Representative, Katrina Murrell attended the hearing. As of 9:23 a.m., the Tenant was not present or represented at the hearing although properly served with notice of this hearing by the Board.

Determinations:

1. The Tenant has not paid the total rent the Tenant was required to pay for the period from January 1, 2021 to July 31, 2021. Because of the arrears, the Landlord served a Notice of Termination effective February 17, 2021.
2. The Tenant is in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful monthly rent is \$1,048.00.
4. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$1,048.00 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord.
5. Interest on the rent deposit is owing to the Tenant for the period from December 18, 2020 to February 17, 2021.
6. The Tenant paid \$5,538.00 after the application was filed.
7. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83 of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (RTA), including the impact of COVID-19 on the parties and whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the

Tenant, and find that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. Unless the Tenant voids the order as set out below, the tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated. The Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before July 30, 2021.
2. As of the date of this order, the amount of the rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit exceeds the arrears of rent and compensation the Landlord is entitled to by \$466.05*.
3. However, the Landlord is authorized to offset the following amounts from the amount the Landlord owes the Tenant:
\$34.45 per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting July 20, 2021 to the date the Tenant moves out of the unit, and
\$186.00 for the cost of filing the application.
4. The Landlord or the Tenant shall pay to the other any sum of money that is owed as a result of this order.
5. If the unit is not vacated on or before July 30, 2021, then starting July 31, 2021, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
6. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord, on or after July 31, 2021.
7. If, on or before July 30, 2021, the Tenant pays the amount of \$1,234.00** to the Landlord or to the Board in trust, this order for eviction will be void. This means that the tenancy would not be terminated and the Tenant could remain in the unit. If this payment is not made in full and on time, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
8. The Tenant may make a motion to the Board under subsection 74(11) of the Act to set aside this order if they pay the amount required under that subsection on or after July 31, 2021 but before the Sheriff gives vacant possession to the Landlord. The Tenant is only entitled to make this motion once during the period of the tenancy agreement with the Landlord.
