



Order under Section 69
Residential Tenancies Act, 2006

Kerri Heroux Tenant

Victoria Street Viillas Inc. (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Kerri Heroux (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on December 21, 2021. Only the Landlord's Legal Representative, Karen Scott, attended the hearing. As of 12:33 p.m., the Tenant was not present or represented at the hearing although properly served with notice of this hearing by the Board.

Determinations:

1. The Tenant has not paid the total rent the Tenant was required to pay for the period from April 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021. Because of the arrears, the Landlord served a Notice of Termination effective August 24, 2021.
2. The Tenant is in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful monthly rent is \$950.00.
4. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$950.00 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord.
5. Interest on the rent deposit is owing to the Tenant for the period from August 15, 2021 to August 24, 2021.
6. The Tenant paid \$950.00 after the application was filed.
7. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83 of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (RTA), including the impact of COVID-19 on the parties and whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the Tenant, and find that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. Unless the Tenant voids the order as set out below, the tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated. The Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before January 18, 2022.
2. The Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$6,896.84*, which represents the amount of rent owing and compensation up to January 7, 2022, less the rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit.
3. The Tenant shall also pay to the Landlord \$31.23 per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting January 8, 2022 to the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.
4. The Tenant shall also pay to the Landlord \$201.00 for the cost of filing the application.
5. If the Tenant does not pay the Landlord the full amount owing* on or before January 18, 2022, the Tenant will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from January 19, 2022 at 2.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
6. If the unit is not vacated on or before January 18, 2022, then starting January 19, 2022, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
7. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord, on or after January 19, 2022.
8. If, on or before January 18, 2022, the Tenant pays the amount of \$8,751.00** to the Landlord or to the Board in trust, this order for eviction will be void. This means that the tenancy would not be terminated and the Tenant could remain in the unit. If this payment is not made in full and on time, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
9. The Tenant may make a motion to the Board under subsection 74(11) of the Act to set aside this order if they pay the amount required under that subsection on or after January 19, 2022 but before the Sheriff gives vacant possession to the Landlord. The Tenant is only entitled to make this motion once during the period of the tenancy agreement with the Landlord.
