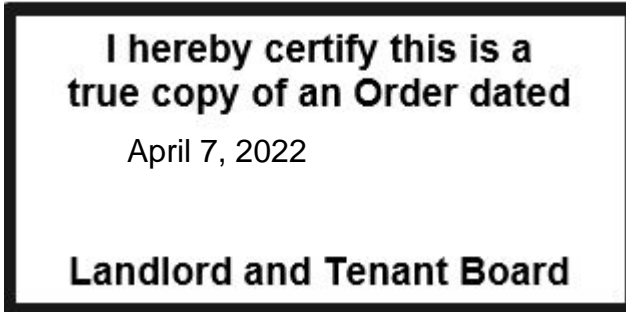

Liza Jamani (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Sheila McIntyre and Zachary Salton (the 'Tenants') because the Tenants did not pay the rent that the Tenants owe.

This application was heard by video conference on March 10, 2022.

The Landlord, the Landlord's Legal Representative, Susan Pereira, and the Tenant, Sheila McIntyre, on behalf of both Tenants, attended the hearing.

Determinations:

1. The Tenants have not paid the total rent the Tenants were required to pay for the period from November 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022. Because of the arrears, the Landlord served a Notice of Termination effective November 16, 2021.
2. The Tenants are in possession of the rental unit.
3. The lawful monthly rent is \$1,300.00.
4. The Tenants paid \$3,904.79 after the application was filed.
5. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$1,300.00 from the Tenants and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord.
6. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with section 83 of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (RTA), including the impact of COVID-19 on the parties and whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the Tenants, and find that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. Unless the Tenants void the order as set out below, the tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenants is terminated. The Tenants must move out of the rental unit on or before **April 18, 2022**.
2. The Tenants shall pay to the Landlord **\$252.92***, which represents the amount of rent owing and compensation up to April 7, 2022, less the rent deposit.
3. The Tenants shall also pay to the Landlord **\$42.74** per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting April 8, 2022 to the date the Tenants move out of the unit.
4. The Tenants shall also pay to the Landlord **\$186.00** for the cost of filing the application.
5. If the Tenants do not pay the Landlord the full amount owing* on or before April 18, 2022, the Tenants will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from April 19, 2022 at 2.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
6. If the unit is not vacated on or before April 18, 2022, then starting April 19, 2022, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
7. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord, on or after April 19, 2022.
8. If, on or before April 18, 2022, the Tenants pay the amount of **\$2,786.00**** to the Landlord or to the Board in trust, this order for eviction will be void. This means that the tenancy would not be terminated, and the Tenants could remain in the unit. If this payment is not made in full and on time, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
9. The Tenants may make a motion to the Board under subsection 74(11) of the Act to set aside this order if they pay the amount required under that subsection on or after April 19, 2022 but before the Sheriff gives vacant possession to the Landlord. The Tenants are only entitled to make this motion once during the period of the tenancy agreement with the Landlord.
