



Order under Section 78(6) Residential Tenancies Act, 2006

Capreit Limited Partnership (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Heidi Nelson (the 'Tenant') and for an order to have the Tenant pay the rent they owe because the Tenant did not meet a condition specified in the order issued by the LTB on April 12, 2023, with respect to application LTB-L-051032-22.

This application was decided without a hearing being held.

Determinations:

1. The order provides that the Landlord can apply to the LTB under section 78 of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act') without notice to the Tenant to terminate the tenancy and evict the Tenant if the Tenant does not meet certain condition(s) in the order. This application was filed within 30 days of the breach.
2. I find that the Tenant has not met the following condition(s) specified in the order:
 - a) **The Tenant failed to pay the full \$1,500.00 towards arrears on or before April 20, 2023**
 - b) **The Tenant failed to pay to the Landlord the lawful rent of \$1,882.32 in full and on time, on or before April 3, 2023**
3. The previous application includes a request for an order for the payment of arrears of rent and the order requires the Tenant to make payments by specific due dates. Accordingly, in addition to eviction, the Landlord is entitled to request an order for the payment of arrears owing.

4. The Tenant was required to pay \$9,351.92 for rent arrears and the application filing fee in the previous order. The amount that is still owing from that order is \$9,351.92 and that amount is included in this order.
5. Since the date of the previous order, the Tenant has failed to pay the full rent that became owing for the period from April 1, 2023, to April 30, 2023.
6. The Landlord is entitled to daily compensation from the day after this order is issued to the date the Tenant moves out of the unit at a daily rate of \$61.88. This amount is calculated as follows: \$1,882.32 x 12, divided by 365 days.

It is ordered that:

1. Order LTB-L-051032-22 is cancelled.
2. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated. The Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before June 3, 2023.
3. If the unit is not vacated on or before June 3, 2023, then starting June 4, 2023, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
4. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after June 4, 2023.
5. The Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$12,657.48 (**less any payments made by the Tenant after this application was filed on April 26, 2023**). This amount represents the rent owing up to May 23, 2023, and the cost of filing the previous application.
6. The Tenant shall also pay to the Landlord \$61.88 per day for compensation for the use of the unit starting May 24, 2023, to the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.
7. If the Tenant does not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before June 3, 2023, the Tenant will start to owe interest. This will be a simple interest calculated from June 4, 2023, at 6.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
