



Order under Section 69 Residential Tenancies Act, 2006

Victoria Park Community Homes (the 'Landlord') applied for an order to terminate the tenancy and evict Taylor Eady (the 'Tenant') because the Tenant did not pay the rent that the Tenant owes.

This application was heard by videoconference on January 16, 2023.

Only the Landlord's legal representative, Karolina Aguiar attended the hearing.

As of 3:20 p.m. the Tenant was not present or represented at the hearing.

Determinations:

1. The Landlord served the Tenant with a Notice to End Tenancy Early for Non-payment of Rent (N4 Notice).
2. As of the hearing date, the Tenant was still in possession of the rental unit.
3. This unit is rent geared to income. The rent from March to July, 2022 was \$151.00. The rent from August to October 2022 was \$971.00. The rent for November 2022 was \$316.00
4. The rent is \$133.00 as of December 1, 2022. It is due on the 1st day of each month.
5. Based on the monthly rent, the daily rent/compensation is \$4.37. This amount is calculated as follows: \$133.00 x 12, divided by 365 days.
6. The Tenant has paid \$934.00 to the Landlord since the application was filed.
7. The rent arrears owing to January 31, 2023 are \$3,316.00.
8. The Landlord incurred costs of \$186.00 for filing the application and is entitled to reimbursement of those costs.
9. The Landlord collected a rent deposit of \$157.60 from the Tenant and this deposit is still being held by the Landlord. The rent deposit can only be applied to the last rental period of the tenancy if the tenancy is terminated.

10. Interest on the rent deposit, in the amount of \$2.06 is owing to the Tenant for the period from January 1, 2021 to January 16, 2023.
11. I have considered all of the disclosed circumstances in accordance with subsection 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act, 2006* (the 'Act'), including the impact of COVID-19 on the parties and whether the Landlord attempted to negotiate a repayment agreement with the Tenant and find that it would be unfair to grant relief from eviction pursuant to subsection 83(1) of the Act.

It is ordered that:

1. The tenancy between the Landlord and the Tenant is terminated unless the Tenant voids this order.
2. **The Tenant may void this order and continue the tenancy by paying to the Landlord or to the LTB in trust:**
 - \$3,635.00 if the payment is made on or before February 24, 2023. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
3. The Tenant may also make a motion at the LTB to void this order under section 74(11) of the Act, if the Tenant has paid the full amount owing as ordered plus any additional rent that became due after February 24, 2023 but before the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) enforces the eviction. The Tenant may only make this motion once during the tenancy.
4. **If the Tenant does not pay the amount required to void this order the Tenant must move out of the rental unit on or before February 24, 2023**
5. If the Tenant does not void the order, the Tenant shall pay to the Landlord \$3,279.26. This amount includes rent arrears owing up to the date of the hearing and the cost of filing the application. The rent deposit and interest the Landlord owes on the rent deposit are deducted from the amount owing by the Tenant. See Schedule 1 for the calculation of the amount owing.
6. The Tenant shall also pay the Landlord compensation of \$4.37 per day for the use of the unit starting January 17, 2023 until the date the Tenant moves out of the unit.
7. If the Tenant does not pay the Landlord the full amount owing on or before February 24, 2023, the Tenant will start to owe interest. This will be simple interest calculated from February 25, 2023 at 5.00% annually on the balance outstanding.
8. If the unit is not vacated on or before February 24, 2023, then starting February 25, 2023, the Landlord may file this order with the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) so that the eviction may be enforced.
9. Upon receipt of this order, the Court Enforcement Office (Sheriff) is directed to give vacant possession of the unit to the Landlord on or after February 25, 2023.
